Collection	Artworks that have been formally accessioned into the art register.	
Conservation	Treatment of artworks by a trained conservator.	
Contemporary	emporary Recent and contemporary art in all media by nationally significant artists, particular	
Art	those associated with south-east Queensland.	
Photography	The Collection contains a number of photographic works and artist prints by artists	
and	associated with south-east Queensland and the Redlands Coast, including North	
Printmaking	Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah), Coochiemudlo Island and the Southern Moreton Bay
